

## COL Stanley “Gene” Reedy

### Inbound TRADOC Capability Manager – Live (TCM-L)

COL Reedy entered the Army through Austin Peay State University, Clarksville Tennessee, ROTC Program in 1988 where he was commissioned as a Field Artillery Second Lieutenant. At Austin Peay State University he earned a Bachelors of Science (BS) in Biology. He later received a Master of Science (MS) in Interactive Training Simulations from the University of Central Florida through the Army’s Advanced Civil Schooling program, and a Master of Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College. His military education includes the Field Artillery Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, Field Artillery Target Acquisition and Survey Officer’s Course, Field Artillery Cannon Battery Officers Course, Multiple Launch Rocket System Cadre Course, Combined Arms and Services Staff School, Command and General Staff Officers Course and the United States Army War College. Prior to his formal assessment into the Simulations Operations Career Field in 1999, COL Reedy served in a variety of assignments. In his initial tour at Fort Campbell, KY, he was a Reconnaissance and Survey Officer in 1st Battalion 320th Field Artillery Regiment, Company Fire Support Officer in 3rd Battalion, 502nd Air Assault Infantry Regiment, Fire Direction Officer and Platoon Leader in 5th Battalion 8th Field Artillery, Brigade Operations Officer and Brigade S3 in the 214th Field Artillery, and subsequently commanded a Multiple Launch Rocket System Artillery Battery in 5th Battalion 17th Field Artillery. He went on to serve as an Army ROTC Cadre at Washington State University, Chief of the Warfighter Simulation and One Semi- Automated Forces Fielding Branch for the National Simulation Center, and Operations Officer for the Korea Battle Simulation Center, Yongsan Korea. Upon completion of graduate school, he served as the Operations Officer for the National Simulation Center, served as the Director of Training and Doctrine Command Project Officer (TPO) for the One Semi-Automated Forces. After completion of the United States Army War College, Carlisle, PA he was assigned to United States Army Central where he served as Chief of Operations, Current Operations supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn and Operation Enduring Freedom, and also served as Chief of Exercises, responsible for all Army exercise in the Central Command AOR.
